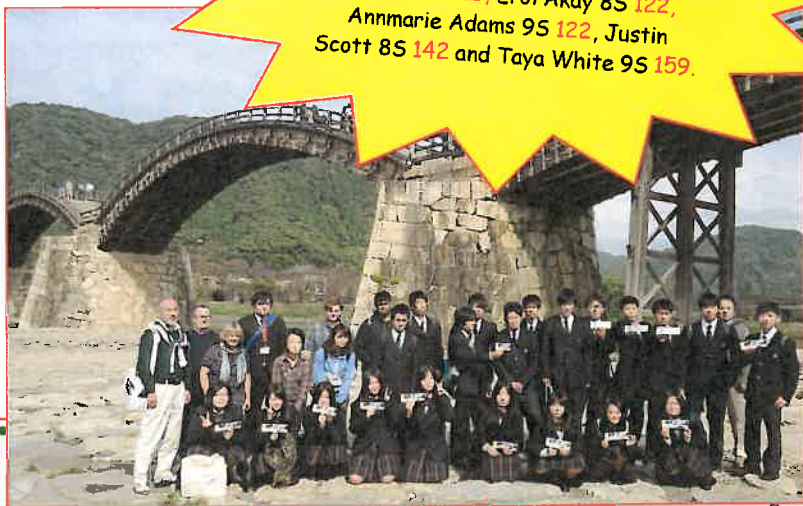
and had lunch with the Chairman of the Town Council afterwards. Da iawn!
