An interview with Mrs Erene Grieves, ex-teacher and philatelist by Ioan Thomas, Library Monitor: Ioan: Could you tell me why you were recently on T.V? Mrs Grieves: Because, for the past 18 years I have been going in to schools talking about stamps. Ioan: What is the oldest stamp in your collection? Mrs Grieves: The 1840 Penny Black. Ioan: How long have you been collecting stamps? Mrs Grieves: For around 63 years. Ioan: How many stamps do you have in total? Mrs Grieves: Too many! Ioan: If you could have any stamp, which one would it be and why? Mrs Grieves: I'd have the 1929 Postal Union Congress stamp because it was originally sold for £1 but is now worth £750. Ioan: What's the most valuable stamp you own? Mrs Grieves: A Victorian stamp worth around £300, but I didn't pay that much



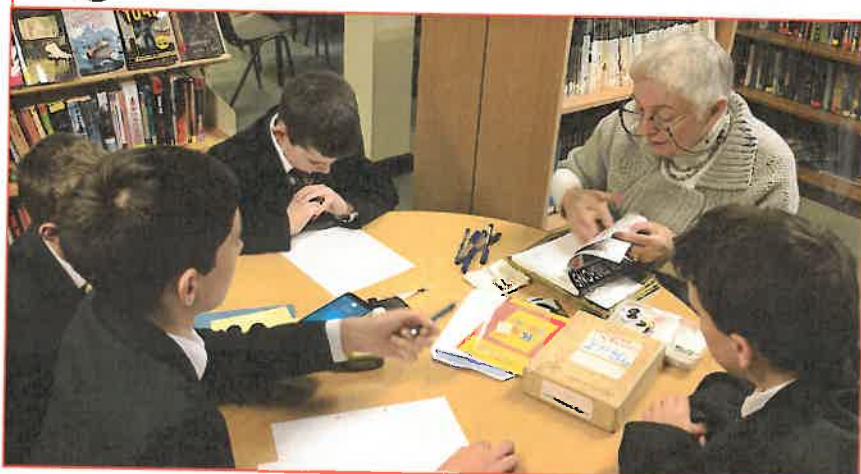
for it. Ioan: Why do you run Stamp Club in the Tasker Milward Library? Mrs Grieves: I have run Stamp Club since I worked in the school 18 years ago.
